No animal has a more distinctive coat than the zebra. Each zebra's stripes are as unique as fingerprints- no two are as exactly alike - although each of the three species has its own general pattern.

Why do zebras have stripes at all? Scientists are not sure, but most of the theories indicate towards their utility as some of camouflage. The patterns may make it difficult for predators to identify a single animal from a running herd and distance at dawn and dusk.
