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A significant source of green energy is wind. Traditionally windmills have been used to pump water for farmers. Wind is different from other energy sources, such as coal and gas, which cause pollution and use up the world's natural resources. Wind does not generate harmful emissions like coal and gas do. The average household consumes approximately 10,000 kWh (Kilo watt - hours) of electricity. Wind energy is also included as one of the options in "green power" plans in some of today's electric companies.

Although wind energy is a clean source of energy, not everyone is in favour of wind turbine generators. First of all, opponents of wind energy say that large birds may fly into the moving blades and be killed. Advocates of wind energy say that more birds are killed by automobiles than by wind turbines. Second, opponents say that wind turbine generators are noisy and disturb residents. Advocates say that there are no studies that prove that residents suffer any problems because of wind turbine farms. A wind turbine is no louder than a refrigerator.
