Hudson, though, was advised against sitting up for longer than five minutes because of the risk of being smothered by flab. Then in 1987, he found himself wedged in the doorway. "The day I got stuck in that door," he recalled, "was when the Lord got me the help I needed." "We think what might have happened," said Gregory about his new client, "is that in 27 years of lying around he might, because of the reading of his Bible, have taken on the same characteristics as Buddhist monks slowed down the biological processes. But we don't know."

Gregory placed Hudson on a 1,200 calorie-a-day diet of raw fruit and orange juice. For exercise he was advised to lie in bed waving his arms about like a conductor.

Hudson soon lost some four inches off his knees, and within three months had shed 178 kg. It began to look as if he might fulfil such ambitions as visiting his mother's grave, riding on the New York subway, driving into the country - and even flying to a clinic in the Bahamas, from which he envisaged emerging as a sylph of 13 stones.

But it was not to be. At the time of his death, of an apparent heart attack, Hudson reportedly weighed 508 kg. Rescue workers had to cut a large hole in the wall of his bedroom to remove the body. He was unmarried.
